
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INSTRUCTIONS FOR #61506 CAGE INSTALLATION KIT


This kit contains: 6 each beam clamps, 6 each pulleys, 1 roll nylon cord and 1 coil of rope (about 600 feet).

STEP 1 - Lay the net cage out on the floor.

STEP 2 - Use a ladder to position the beam clamps and pulleys in the ceiling. See sketch a and B. Tighten all nuts and bolts on the beam clamps. String a length of rope through each pulley. Each rope should be about 100 feet long.



Sketch A - This is the top view of the cage looking down from the ceiling. The X's show the location of the six pulleys in the ceiling.



Sketch B - This shows how the beam clamps and pulleys attach to ceiling beams.

NOTE: To install, screw eye bolt tight up against the hook rod, then tighten bottom nut on eye bolt and nut on hook rod.


STEP 3 - Tie one end of each rope into the top of each net cage.

STEP 4 - Pull the six ropes to raise the cage. Bottom edge of net must touch the floor.

STEP 5 - When the six ropes are pulled up the net may drape and sag between the hanging points. The drape can be correct by hanging extra lines from the ceiling to support the net. These extra lines can be tied permanently in place and do not have to run through pulleys. Two such lines are shown in Sketch C.

You can use the roll of nylon cord included with the kit. Add as many extra support lines as you want to give the net its proper shape. When the cage is not in use it can be pulled up to the ceiling so it is out of the way for other activities.

Sketch C - Each of the six support ropes is tied to a wall cleat to hold the cage up. Wall cleats are installed at the time many gyms are built so they are not included with this set. Wall cleats are available at most hardware stores if your walls do not have them.



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
